- b. Fairly new platform (not launched yet?)
  - i. Contacted Barbara from the Pharmacists Clinic
- c. wanted to gather more students and pharmacists
- d. "What do they expect from this partnership"
  - i. No reply yet
- e. *Alex: ask for money in order to advertise for them.*
  - i. *Have them talk to the grad reps in order to promote their system*
  - ii. *Possible events: Champagne event*
  - iii. *probably at least \$1000.*
    1. *If they want to do it continuously over the year/put it on our PhUS website.*
- f. *Mimi: No rush to get a response*
- g. *Action items:*
  - i. *Alex contact them to see what you can do*

## 3. UpToDate Subscription - Mimi and Sam

- a. Offering a \$25 USD per student. 800 student amount
  - i. Unlimited sign-ins
  - ii. Charge us based on the number we give them.
  - iii. Discounted offer that they are GIVING TO PhUS vs their online offer.
  - iv. We should look into this more because it's a really good deal :)
  - v. We may want to host a referendum to see if students want to pay \$20 more to pay for UpToDate Subscription.
- b. We have about \$15,000 (from pharmacist's letter + etc..) and would not be able to sustain this without additional funding.
- c. *Sherry: Idea to either keep it as PART of the membership FEE or as a separate title so students can see it as a 'distinction'*
- d. *Exec Director: How do the 4th years weigh in on the decision because they won't benefit themselves.*
  - i. *Sam: We can offer them an extra year of subscription after they graduate*
- e. *Ada: Need to consider perspective of IA team, since we don't have IAs that revolve around UpToDate*
  - i. *Exec Director: IA has access to Up-To-Date*
- f. *Action items:*
  - i. *Sam/Mimi: See if students are willing to pay, see if faculty can invest in it (?).*
  - ii. *Sam: Implement referendum (?).*

## 4. Peer tutoring in IA status - Jenah

- a. Because of the change in schedules, we haven't been able to accommodate **Peer Tutoring**



- i. Discussed with certain IA leads (Jon)
  1. IA Leads say:
    - a. will lose some to follow-up
- ii. Previously, peer tutoring was an elective course.
  1. one 3rd year to about 10 first years. 30 third years in the course.
  2. 3rd years would be responsible to make sessions to go over counseling, DIR, physical assessment.
    - a. PRO:
      - i. 1st years: The utility would be more exposure.
      - ii. 3rd year: Practice their own skills and teach.
    - b. CON:
      - i. 1st years: Would have to pick times to meet.
      - ii. 3rd years have to pay because ELECTIVE
- iii. May not work because class schedules don't align
- iv. Things to discuss: Marks
- v. How does council feel about it?
  1. 1st year: How about 4th years?
    - a. Reply: They are on practicum
  2. Ada: When i was a 1st year, I remember talking to a lot of BSc and they helped outline what I needed to learn as a first year student and I found it very beneficial, a lot of that happened outside of school hours. It is VOLUNTARY and it is difficult to judge participation, but from my understanding
  3. Mimi: It is so valuable to have students come in, shadow IAs, and share their perspective too
  4. Riaaz: Good opportunity to practice skills that we might have forgotten. Given that we have a 473 teaching rotation, could be a good option to see if it's a good choice for us in the future, rather than regretting it!
  5. Jenah: This pertains more to 1st and 3rd years. Is this something that 3rd years feel as an elective course?
  6. Sellenne: So it's the same price as every other elective right?
    - a. Jenah: Yes. Same price.
  7. Caitlyn: 3 credits?
    - a. Jenah: Yes
  8. Sellenne: I think it's a good idea, but because of the cost of the elective, it could be more of a volunteer opportunity.
    - a. Jenah: You get the understanding of how the teaching process works, formulating your own marking scheme, very equivalent to 473 almost. You get good exposure. The learning you are doing is more independent.
  9. Mimi: We can compare this to a directed studies opportunity.
  10. 1st year: Can we add a teaching component to it? Like instead of Ali, students can teach a supplementary IA?
    - a. Jenah: Because of X amount of people who could be registered, it would be hard.



11. Sellenne: I think if it were structured like a directed studies, it seems like a good opportunity.
