"The transgender community faces many barriers and challenges when accessing healthcare, resulting in a health discrepancy in this underserved population. One of these major barriers is fear—fear of not being accepted, fear of being asked to prove their gender, and fear of being outed in public, which increases their risk of experiencing physical, mental, and emotional violence from bystanders. Almost all these fears are fueled by past experiences.

Many healthcare providers feel uncomfortable treating transgender patients, whether due to personal beliefs, lack of education/exposure, or simply not knowing how to interact with these patients in a gender-affirming way. The latter two are, in large part, the result of implicit biases and social stigma. The best way to address these is through exposure and education in a safe environment, which will be provided by this activity.

This activity features a one hour talk from Marni Panas, a Canadian transwoman with a passion for LGBTQ2S+ activism. Marni is a Canadian Certified Inclusion Professional (CCIP), has helped draft an apology speech for Prime Minister Justin Trudeau that was delivered to the LGBTQ2S+ community in Canada in 2017, and has received a humanitarian award from John Humphrey Centre for Peace and Human Rights. During her talk, Marni will share her personal journey as a transgender woman, discuss the key barriers and challenges the transgender population face when accessing healthcare, and provide practical advice on how to make your practice more inclusive.

Marni's talk will be followed up by a 30-minute presentation by Cherryl Pacheco, an experienced pharmacist who interacts with transgender patients regularly. Cherryl will provide their perspective on the importance of gender-affirming care and highlight the role pharmacists play in supporting patients through their transition."
